
Directions for Bill of Rights Cards

- 1. Print out cards and laminate.
- 2. Print out control card and laminate.
- 3. Explain the difference in fact and opinion.
- 4. Before doing this work, the child should have been exposed to history of the founding of America, the American Revolution, and the Declaration of Independence/Constitution.
- 5. The child should set the amendment cards in a stack over to the side of the workspace. The cards with the 'rights' should also be placed in a stack under the amendment cards. The heading cards should be placed in the center of the workspace (towards the top).
 The child lays out the amendment cards in a column directly under the Amendment Heading card. Then, the child chooses a 'rights' card and matches it to the correct amendment.
- 9. Child checks answers with control card.

(Show child how to mix up cards before putting the work back in its place - this ensures that the next time the work is used, the cards are not already in the correct order)
